Your Pastor's Heart

I'm sure you and I both have stopped in the middle of doing something and asked ourselves, "Why am I doing this?" If I were to ask you, "Why?" You might respond with "Why not?" or "Why what?" It might be good for us as a church to take those responses and ask ourselves ... "Why not ask why of what we are doing?" The purpose of asking why is not for doubting ourselves, but for the purpose of clarification. To clarify the why says we make it clear again in our understanding why we are doing something. I believe as some of our ministries begin again this fall it is a good time to stop and ask ourselves, "Why" ... that is, "Why are we doing what we are doing? Along with that we might ask, "Why did we begin this ministry?" and "What were our mission, aim, and purpose in starting it in the first place?" As creatures of habit we can easily fall into doing things because we've always done them. No matter how well intended we are in what we do, it is good to stop and reconnect with the "why" of what we are doing. As it can help us discern and decide if we are being successful to the original intent, as well as help us refresh our vision of what we are doing. Vision to me is simply "seeing and believing" ... seeing what we are doing and believing in the why we are doing it. I shared this past week with our Church Council of the "why" question I was reminded that the such a question be both good and difficult to answer. We need to consider such in a heart of humility, seeking God's best. My hope and desire is that in the coming times of our church life (as well as personal life in Christ) we begin to ask the "why" all across our ministries and acts of service. So I ask you to pray with me, think with me and work with me in asking ourselves, "Why am I doing this?" Together let's do all things to the glory of God.
